DRESS CODE PHILOSOPHY AND OBJECTIVES

There is a correlation between a student's decorum and attitude and his/her manner of dress. There is a wide range of available clothing that reflects a positive attitude and appearance. We ask that LCS upper school students wear clothing that is clean, neat, and appropriate. Clothing and other items our students wear must not disrupt the educational process, create safety concerns or create any distraction.

We understand that students/ families come from unique and diverse backgrounds. If your cultural background has a particular style that is not able to be expressed within our dress code please speak with the Dean of Learning or Head of School.

Objectives:

1. LCS acknowledges that one's outward appearance does not define an individual, but it does express our ideas, posture, style, and values. We are a community that expects excellence and experiences Christ. Our dress should reflect excellence and Christ.
2. Character building is deeply valued at LCS, and our dress code is part of that initiative. The dress code provides a platform for students to grow in respect, humility, wisdom, integrity, and diligence. For example, students have the opportunity to grow in wisdom as they evaluate what is appropriate to wear to school. Where students disagree with dress code policy, they have the opportunity to grow in humility and learn respect for community guidelines.
