



## FIFTH GRADE SUPPLY LIST

Dear Future Fifth Grader,

Are you ready to embark on a grand adventure? I anticipate great things to come in our time together! God is so good to give us this upcoming year to learn how to better love Him and others and to explore this wonderful world that He has made. I am praying for you until we meet again in September. Please see below for supplies that you will need to start the new school year. Please bring in these items on the first day of school unless otherwise noted. Enjoy your summer!

### **Some items may need to be replenished later in the yr.**

- 2 large boxes of Kleenex
- 1 small bag of individually-wrapped candy (e.g. lifesavers, dumdums, laffy taffy, kisses, Werther's. Airheads, etc.)
- 1 large container of antibacterial wipes (Clorox or generic is fine)
- 1, 12 count package of sharpened pencils (no need to write names on these)
- 3 pads of yellow Post-it notes size 3x3
- 1 box of ERASABLE colored pencils, 8 count is fine (these are for corrections, so erasable is vital☺)
- 1 box of crayons, 8 count is fine
- 1 Three ring binder, 1 inch (white, with clear encasing on the outside in which to slip a title page)
- 1 150 pg. pack of wide-ruled paper – loose leaf
- 100 index cards
- 1 fun folder that you love, 3-hole punched. Label one pocket “stays at home” & one “return to school.”
- 1 other fun folder that you love, 3 hole punched. Label this folder on the outside “study hall.”
- 3 folders with pockets and hole punched (**1 green** folder labeled Science on the outside, **1 yellow** folder labeled ELA on the outside, **1 blue** folder: labeled Social Studies/State Report on the outside.
- 1 red college-ruled, 3-hole punched notebook, 100 pages: label it Math.
- 1 composition notebook labeled “Science Notebook” (the marbled kind, any color)
- Bible- A Bible that your child already owns is great; if they don't have a Bible, ESV is a good version that we use quite a bit.
- 1 pair of ear buds, headphones are fine too (you can get ear-buds for around \$1 at Wal-Mart)
- 2 large pink erasers
- A pair of scissors
- 1 highlighter
- 2 dry erase markers (for doing Math problems on a white board)
- 2 glue sticks (*Elmer's extra strength permanent bond please*)
- 1 soft pencil pouch (for 3 mechanical pencils, pens, highlighter, 1 lrg. pink eraser, earbuds, 1 glue stick, 1 post it pad)
- 1 hard pencil case to keep in cubby (for colored pencils, post-it notes, colors, extra pencils, 3 extra post-it pads & extra glue stick)

- Sketch book: 8-1/2" x 11" or 9" x 12", 50 sheets, spiral bound, 70#weight (for art)
- We will read the novel: Shiloh by Naylor. You may wait and request these at your local library as we go along, or try and get them ahead of time. Used copies on Amazon, at garage sales, Craigslist and other websites are great and often super cheap! We are also reading Number the Stars and Drums at Saratoga, but I was able to purchase class sets so you don't have to obtain them! 😊
